

### Do you want to improve the energy efficiency of your home?

### The Globe Willow

You will probably have seen by now that one of the most iconic trees in Stonehouse – the Globe Willow – has received some drastic pruning work recently. Unfortunately, the willow suffered significant damage in one of the November storms which resulted in a split on the stem opening up significantly. Having considered the matter very carefully, including options such as repollarding and bracing, with the help of professional arboricultural advice it was decided that by taking drastic action now, we could improve the chances of the tree recovering and thriving.

The tree work was carried out safely and professionally by a qualified and experienced arboricultural contractor, using a mobile elevated platform because the willow was too dangerous to climb. The remaining section of stem is expected to regenerate strongly. It will be very closely cared for, and in time it is expected to develop a new canopy to ensure that the Globe Willow - planted in 1921 - can continue for years to come as the centrepiece of the Stonehouse Community Arboretum. If and when replacement is required, cuttings have been taken and are growing around Stonehouse so that a genetically identical clone can be planted in place of the original.

### Spring opening for Ship Inn space!

We as a community, achieved a lot in 2024:

- · Events were attended throughout the year, extending the membership of the group and informing anybody that is interested, what the idea was and the plan for the site
- . A survey was carried out on the Site use and how people could access the space, which has added significantly to our plans and thoughts on how you would like to use the site.
- · All the necessary surveys and biodiversity reports were carried out. These are vital to ensuring that when the site is developed by the community, the result will give more back to the ecology than it removed. Our thanks go to the Town Council who has financed this vital step and allowed us all to get access to the site. The Town Council and District **Councillors have facilitated a Licence with Stroud** District Council to allow SpICE use of the land until March 2026.
- Cotswold Canals Connected used a tractor to cut the overgrown scrub on the site and 52 (in total) generous volunteers from the membership came and cleared the vegetation (approx 60 cu meters of it!) and a Bridgend resident removed it for

The initial phase of allowing you all to use the site is now underway. The Town Council have allocated funds for a seating area to be created along with information board and pedestrian access gate. See you on site this spring!

### Mayor's Column

Firstly, a Happy New Year to all our residents from everyone at the Town Council, including staff and councillors. 2025 is going to be a busy year in Stonehouse.

First of all, I would like to mention the issues we are having with the historic 103-year-old willow on the Town Green. This tree had been a much loved and prominent feature of Stonehouse for generations, but like all things, it has got old and diseased beyond saving. The only safe thing to do was to prune the tree back to a degree whereby it might just be able to regenerate and sprout a new sibling, rather like the sycamore on Hadrian's Wall. The Council arrived at this potential solution only after a great deal of thought and consultation with local tree expert, John Parker. We want to keep the tree's genetics alive and will give the pruned stump time to regenerate but if it's not successful, we have clones of the tree waiting in cultivation to be transplanted.

Still on the subject of trees, many of you will be aware of the groundbreaking Community Arboretum plan your Council adopted a couple of years ago. To keep the plan as a living and developing initiative, I was successful in proposing and introducing a new Arboretum and Open Spaces Working Group. The Group consists of councillors and experts and will focus on developing and implementing the Arboretum plan as well as developing projects and initiatives to improve our open spaces in terms of tree planting and other environmental measures.

By the time this reaches you, we will hopefully have completed the new mains sewerage project at Oldends Lane which will do away with an obsolete septic tank and allow both the sports pavilion and Stonehouse Town F.C. to take advantage of mains drainage for the first time. I know this is not a glamorous project, but it has been technically challenging, and money well spent. I should like to thank all those members of staff and councillors who have worked so hard to achieve this.





### Learning outdoors at the Stonehouse Park Federation

We are very lucky at Stonehouse Park Federation to have extensive grounds, well-established trees and an eco-garden which includes a pond where frogs and newts flourish. We are also extremely lucky to have parents who have given their time to renovate the area. It is a privilege to see children's faces light up with wonder after a siting of a newt and to be able to provide a lunch-time moment of quiet exploration. There were similar magical moments last summer when children stayed to see the birds of prey in after-school club.

Forest Learning fosters this school-wide awareness of the outdoors. Miss Sanders, a fully trained Forest School Leader,

organises these sessions with all year-groups. The aim is for learning to be child-led but Miss Sanders has also developed a rich variety of activities exploring wild-life and the environment. Parents will probably not be surprised to find the most popular activity is den-building! Rosie Todd from the Wildlife Trust also regularly visits Year 3 to talk about local nature.

These activities have enormous value inspiring the children, encouraging active learning, providing a resource for other lessons and supporting a full understanding of the curriculum.

Putting out some fresh water and cat biscuits will help them as they awake from hibernation.

Hedgehogs often face dangers in our gardens as we start to clear away the winter and plan for the Spring. Please check areas of long grass and under hedges before you start to strim or cut back shrubs. We have already admitted a hedgehog with strimmer injuries from Stonehouse this year.


If you would like to report an issue with footpaths the first port of call is Highways online at FixMyStreet Gloucestershire, however your new Parish Warden covering MST & EST footpaths in Stonehouse and Standish can also make assessments and report back to Cotswold Volunteer Warden work parties in our area.

In addition to clearing overgrown footpaths, work parties help to conserve and enhance the Cotswolds National Landscape, taking part in a range of projects from drystone walling, hedge laying, and tree planting, to installing kissing gates and pond restoration.

The Standish area stretches as far North as Haresfield Beacon and to the M5 in the West. It also encompasses Standish Woods. Including the parish of Stonehouse, it is a large area for one volunteer, so if you regularly monitor, walk or keep these routes clear please contact us so that your assistance and/or hard work can be recognised officially, and our workload can be targeted more effectively across these two parishes.
