In April I had the pleasure of hosting the Annual Town Meeting and had the privilege of introducing a number of guest speakers who gave updates on the great work going on in our community, and also presented the Annual Civic awards to those individuals and organisations deemed to have contributed most, in a number of different ways, to the life of the town in the last year.

The detailed Annual Report from the Town Council is available online and printed in this edition of Stonehouse News.

North and Central wards recently saw two separate By-elections following the departure of two former councillors and we are delighted to welcome Cllr Carol Trim (North) and Cllr John Parker (Central) to the now full complement of Town councillors. Both John and Carol are, I know, delighted to have been elected and will work hard for our community in the years to come. I would also like to take this public opportunity to thank former Councillor Gary Powell for all his hard work for the Town over many years, both as a Town and District councillor but also in his role with Stonehouse in Bloom.

There has been much in the press recently about the government decision to turn Gloucestershire into a unitary authority and effectively do-away with our District councils. We do not yet know the full implications of these proposed changes but what is almost certain is that there will be a number of significant challenges for Town and Parish councils like us, to meet. As well as the probability of having to take over some legacy services from the District, there may also be some potential opportunities for us. In order to best prepare for these changes, we are in the process of setting-up a specific Working Group to look at these issues and plan for the future in advance.

There is much going on in the Town so please keep an eye on the Town Council website and Facebook profile for news and information, as well as the traditional town notice boards.

# Stonehouse Town Council Annual Report 2024-2025

## Introduction from the Town Mayor – Cllr Neil Glbbs

Last May saw the Town Council elections and a number of new members were elected to our 3 wards (North, Central and South). Immediately following this election, due to the anomalies of the system we were short of members, and we had to fill these vacancies by co-opting 3 additional councillors. Since then, Gary Powell has retired after many years' service to our town and another councillor decided to move on. This created another void which was recently filled by two separate by-elections.

We have also seen some changes to council staffing. Our Senior Maintenance Officer has moved on and Paul has been promoted to Senior Town Maintenance Officer. We have been successful in recruiting a replacement Town Maintenance Officer, Tony Gaylard, and would like to welcome him to the council. We are pleased to say that David Marsden will be job sharing the post of Business Support Officer with Carla when she returns from maternity leave.

The last 12 months have seen some seismic activity in town with the SpICE community group finally taking temporary possession of the old Ship Inn site for a canal side facility. This work has been facilitated by the Town Council in conjunction with Stroud District Council who own the site. We will have to wait until 2026 to see what the final arrangements for permanently occupying the site will be, but we are grateful for the District's co-operation in making this long discussed aspiration a reality.

There are very major changes in the offing with the Government's proposed move to unitary status for Gloucestershire. We do not know what these changes will look like at present or what final decisions will be made that will affect our town, but we can be certain that changes there will be. You will be glad to know that we are in the process, with other Towns and Parishes, to try to plan and prepare as far as possible in advance. This is a rapidly changing dynamic, and we must, as a small local authority, be prepared to meet those challenges head on.

We have a committed and forward-looking group of councillors and staff with a number of major environmental projects in the pipeline. not the least of which is the town arboretum plan. We have just completed a major capital sewer improvement scheme for Oldends Lane and the Football Club which will help bring our facilities up to modern standards and we are also still leading on the re-opening of the Bristol Road/Stroudwater railway station which could provide a major link direct to Bristol.

Finally, I would like to thank you, the folk of Stonehouse, for your ongoing support. All our councillors are volunteers and work hard for Stonehouse. Please be assured that party politics do not play any part in Town Council decisions. We all live here and want to do the very best for our community and that's the way it should be.

## Business Committee activities/ achievements

The Committee has been chaired by Cllr Theresa Watt with Cllr Carol Kambites serving as Vice Chair. The Committee has a 'Terms of Reference' that can be viewed online; it covers the review of council policies, scrutinises the council's finances, oversees the council's staffing including their training, and generally supports the council in its efforts to deliver quality services to the community. The Committee also checks the draft budget before it is presented

Owing to the increased costs of contracted services across the board and a much-needed increase in staffing levels, the precept has had to be increased by 6.21% in 2025, representing an increase of £10.34 per property per year.

### **Environment Committee**

The Committee has been chaired by Cllr Debbie Curtis, with Cllr Keith Creighton, serving as Vice Chair.

#### This year, the Committee has:

- Continued to support Stonehouse in Bloom in its efforts to prepare for the RHS Heart of England in Bloom National finals in 2024 with new planting containers and plant suppliers. They won Gold in the Heart of England in Bloom and Winner of Best Small-Town Category.
- Supported the Events Working Group in organising community events such as Goodwill and supporting the Canal Spring Festival.
- Undertook a tree survey of trees in Doverow Wood and various other trees in the town, including the Willow at the Globe. Following the tree surveyor's recommendations, employed qualified and certified specialists to carry out the necessary remedial works.
- Continued to support the necessary works to get approval from Stroud District Council to extend the allotments at Stagholt and develop a natural community area.
- Supported the canal rejuvenation to develop future opportunities for economic regeneration, health & wellbeing, and environmental conservation that will come with the restored canal.
- Continued to support the Ship Inn site clearance and maintenance, supporting the purchases of a wireless CCTV camera, new gates, a shed and tables and benches in an effort to secure the land long term.
- Continued to support the Town Council's work on ensuring the town's Public Rights of Way remain protected in Verney Fields.
- Supported highway improvements through its Transport and Highways working group.
- Provided support for the community's most vulnerable through its Support Stonehouse working group, All Pulling Together (APT) and its contributors.
- Supported the match funding of a Community Defibrillator to go on Town Council/Library building.
- Supported the adoption of the BT Telephone kiosk outside the Town Hall.
