Minutes of a Town Business Committee held on Monday 8th July '24 at 7.00pm at the Town Hall

There were no public questions. The representatives from Magpies Social Club were offered the opportunity to talk during agenda item B/729

B/716 To receive apologies

There were apologies from Cllrs Carol Kambites and Keith Terry. Cllr John Callinan confirmed that he would be late to the meeting.

B/717 To receive Declarations of Interest

There were no declarations of interest

B/718 To approve the minutes of the Business Committee meeting held on 3rd June '24

Committee APPROVED the minutes as a true and accurate record of the meeting

Cllr John Callinan attended the meeting at 7.07pm

B/719 To receive the latest budget position

Attention was drawn to the following budget lines: Contracted staff - a recent decision by FTC has increased the budget by £25k (not yet shown); Town Hall/Library and Pod rates - rates have been paid 'In year'; Pavilion Electricity usage - recharge not yet resolved from last year or this year but being monitored.

Committee **NOTED** the Clerk's comments and the budget report showing a total 'Actual Net' Expenditure of £96,709.92; a total 'Actual Net' Income of £194,409.21 and a Reserve expenditure of £3,344.46

Committee agreed for the Chair brought forward agenda item B/729 for discussion

<u>B/729</u> To discuss and recommend the renewal of the council's lease arrangements with Magpies Social Club

The Club Chair provided an overview of the club's work to date to improve the inside of the building along with its plans to focus on the external parts of the building that are in real need of attention. He was able to confirm that their user base is increasing in light of the improvements made to date. Committee was concerned that the Club had not formed useful links with Stonehouse Town Football Club (STFC) as their would be added benefit to the community of a joint facility. The Club Chair explained that attempts have been made but not well received. The football club appeared to have moved on with its own plans. There was also concern that the club continues as a Members only club. It was explained that whilst there are alternative options available to the club, these present additional challenges - an example was provided in relation to the cost of Sky subscriptions significantly increasing should the club become a Public House. The club were however keen to acknowledge that its current status as a Members only club presented its own difficulties and in an attempt to try and overcome them, the club suggested that it could offer a lower membership fee of £1 to allow anyone to drink and enjoy the facilities; the higher membership would be retained to allow subscribers to benefit from reduced alcohol prices.

Committee **DEFFERED** the matter until it had received a copy of the current lease. It was acknowledged that delaying a decision at this stage would create uncertainty amongst customers and the brewery.

B/720 To approve the latest payments list

Committee APPROVED the latest payment list totalling £15,303.21

B/721 To receive an update on the council's Nat West bank account Committee NOTED the Clerk's update confirming to the last payment by Nat West to the council's Lloyds Operating account of £862.06. The Council's account with the Nat West is now closed.

B/722 To receive an update on the council's Lloyds operating account Since forwarding the support papers for this meeting, the Clerk is now able to confirm that Lloyds bank have now corrected their IT glitch and as a result, once again, all payments require two full signatories to authorize payment. Further to this, the Deputy Clerk has now been accepted by Lloyds bank as a partial signatory and is able to load payments onto the bank payment process for authorisation by full signatories. Adding Cllrs John Callinan and Neil Gibbs as full signatories on the Lloyds account is still being progressed The disruption to the council's payment process has forced Officers to take remedial action in terms of signing off payments on 'Edge'. Due to the fact that the Clerk had been able to authorize some payments (at the bank) without input from full signatories, he has signed off the payment on 'Edge' in order to show consistency. Details have been covered by the support papers Committee NOTED the updates

B/723 To review the council's Scale of Charges

The discussion centered mainly on the use of the Council's recreation parks by small businesses wishing to run outdoor classes for Yoga, dog training etc. free of charge. It was felt that the current 'Scale of Charges' allow for this. It was

recommended that explanations relating to this and events generally (items numbered 2 and 4) needed to be refreshed; it was felt that Hopelands School would fit into this category. Also, the charge for stall holders needed to be altered to the current charge of £5 per stall per occasion.

Business Committee **RECOMMENDED** Council to approve the revised Scale of Charges 2024

B/724 To approve The Door's latest spending proposal

Committee APPROVED The Door's spending proposal totalling £2,918 - this represents the costs detailed in points 1-6 of the proposal.

Committee also APPROVED the optional cost of £2,000 associated with point 7 of the proposal subject to The Door being unable to fund the trips through other sources.

<u>B/725</u> To approve the following grant applications in relation to Doverow Hill Woods

1. Printing of a publication called 'The history of Doverow Hill' Committee felt that the publication was a very worthwhile project that would provide a great insight as to the history of Doverow Hill and also thanked John Parker for his time and commitment to the town.

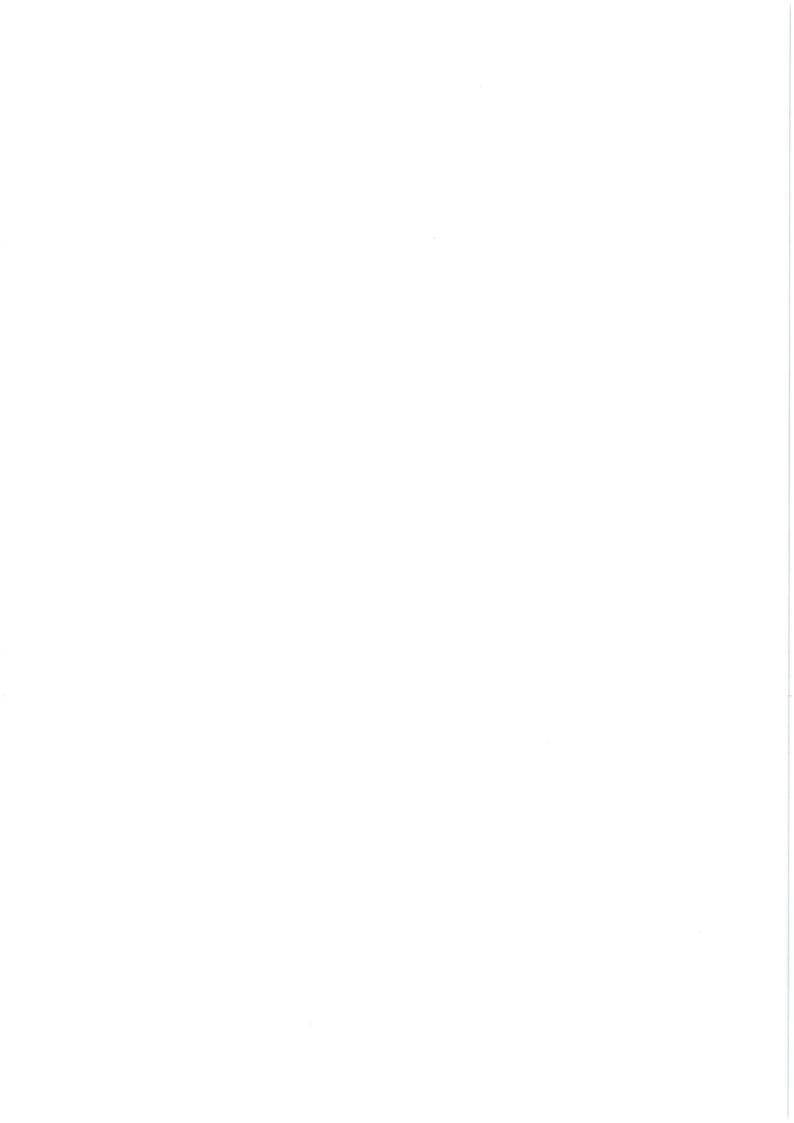
<u>B/726</u> To recommend for town council approval the award of the sewer pipe installation contract at Oldends Lane

Committee members were brought upto speed on the working groups progress and resultant recommendation as detailed in supporting papers. Whilst the amount of money involved in the installation work will be substantial, the project will enable all the facilities at Oldends Lane to be fully functional and add significant offerings to the Stonehouse Community. Whilst Council has already put aside Earmarked Reserves for the project, it was felt that seeking Full Council approval to award the contract to the successful contractor 'Cambrain Engineering' at a cost of £75,810.68 plus vat (plus £250 STW admin costs) would be appropriate.

Committee thanked the working group and Project officer for the sheer amount of work they had undertaken.

Committee **RECOMMENDS** town council approve the award of the sewer pipe installation work at Oldends Lane to 'Cambrain Engineering'at a total cost of £75,810.68 plus vat plus STW admin costs of £260.

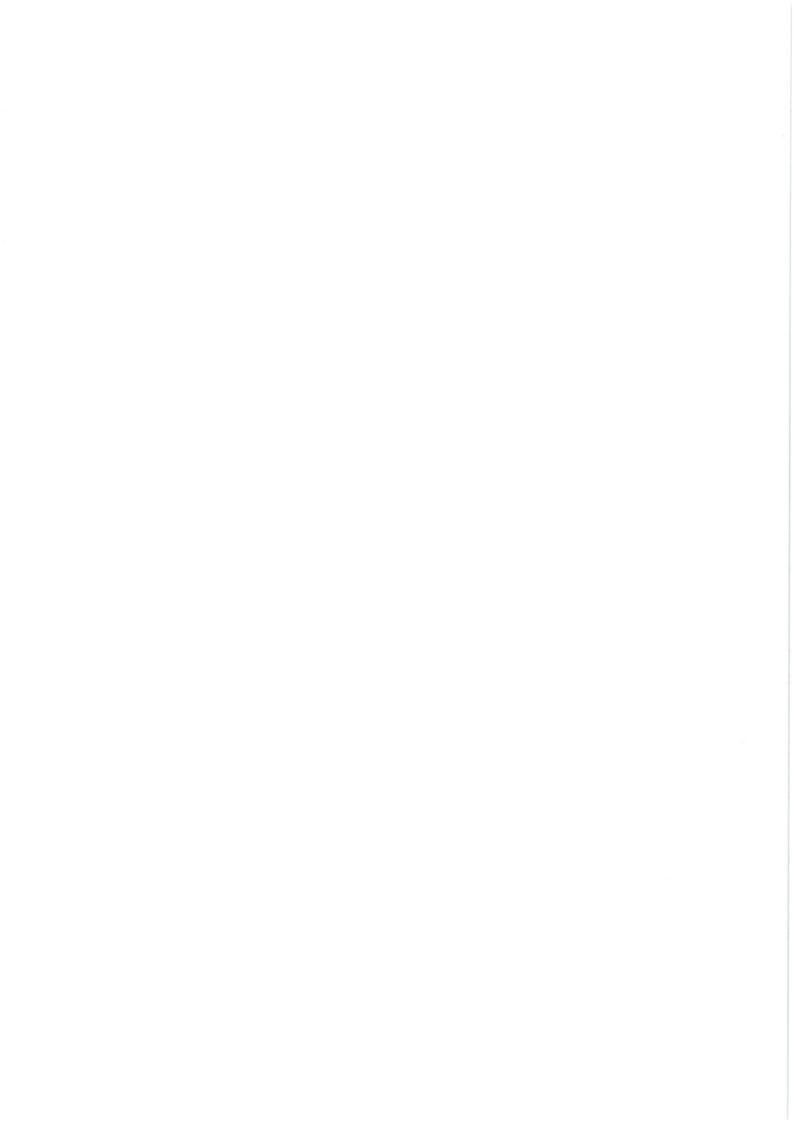

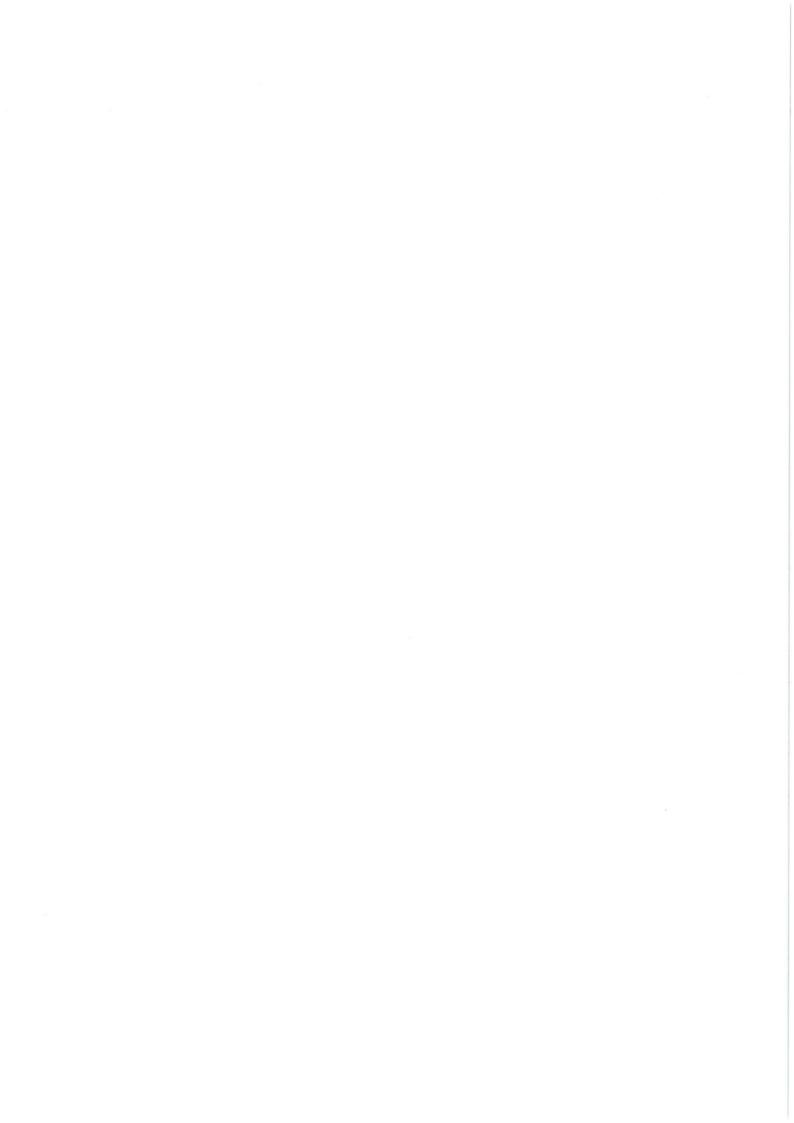

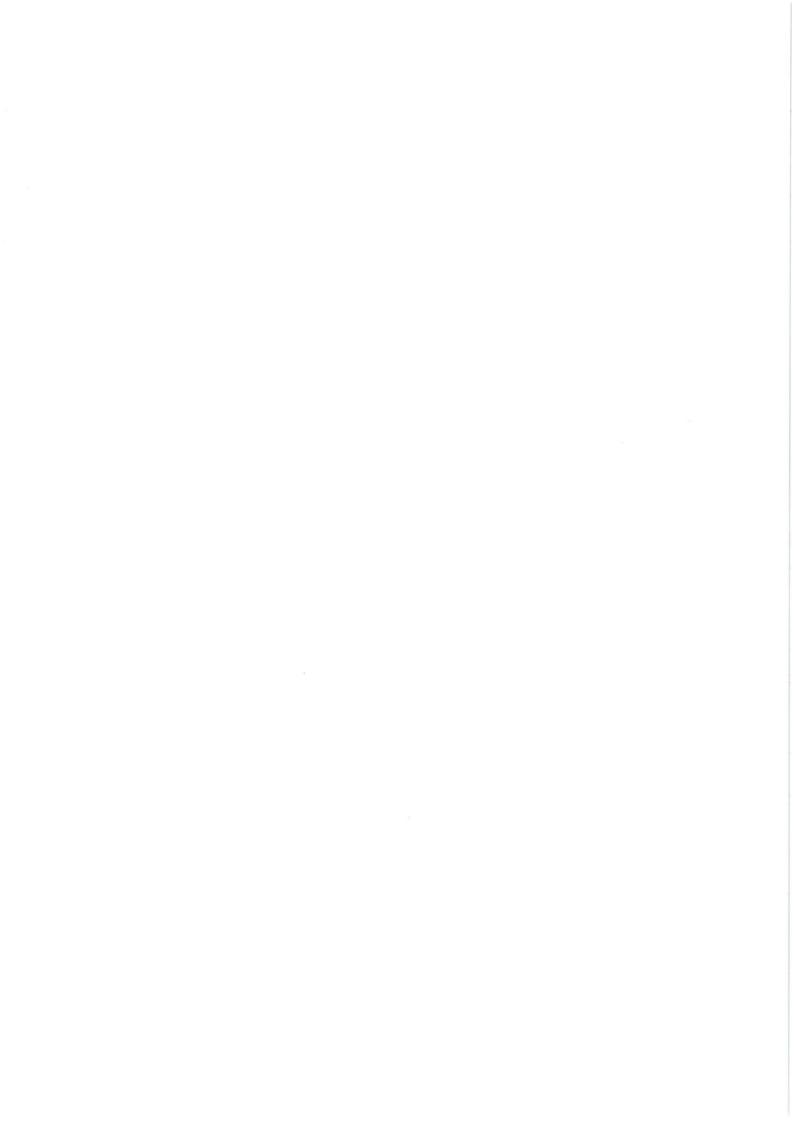

Future Provision of Edge Approval Lists to Councillors

Purpose

The purpose of this proposal is to seek approval for changing and simplifying the lists of expenditure transactions, or Approval/Payment Lists, submitted to Council and Business Committee for authorisation.

Current position

Officers produce a list of expenditure transactions for Full Council or Business
Committee approval prior to making BACS payments. However, these Approval Lists
consist not only of BACS transactions but also payments made by Direct Debit,
Standing Order and Debit Card.

The inclusion of paid items on the Approval/Payment List has several disadvantages:

- The List does not show only those payments requiring prior councillor signatory approval before payment by Lloyds Bank – they include payments already authorised (annually) and paid.
- Councillors are, in effect, asked to retrospectively approve payments made by
 Direct Debit and Standing Order unnecessarily. Approval has already been
 granted at the start of each year by FTC. This duplication of authorisation
 takes up a considerable amount of officers' time as there is a constant need
 for cross referencing between lists; this can be fairly confusing at times.
- At present, because D/D and S/O transactions cannot be closed off on Edge until this retrospective authorisation, Edge is slow to reflect the current financial situation when producing various budget reports.
- Edge Approval/Payment Lists do not provide a 'Payment Type' column
 heading therefore, after councillors approval, officers have to work through the
 list, cross referencing against bank statements, to strike out all non-BACS
 transactions to ensure that they are not paid again by BACS in error (albeit
 this is a rare occurrence); a process that takes time. Producing a BACS
 transactions only list would lead to considerable clarification and further time
 saving for officers and signatories.

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Unlike D/D and S/O payments, Debit Card transactions are not pre-authorised though, when practicable, officers do seek pre-authorisation. Officers also limit the use of the STC Debit Card as far as possible. However, sometimes items are needed urgently, e.g. Health and Safety equipment; also many traders will only accept card payments rather than setting up an account. Therefore, officers will be required to continue seeking retrospective authorisation for card payments.

Change to Adding Transactions

In the last few weeks, officers have amended how transactions are entered on to Edge. For each new transaction, the 'Payment Type' field is now completed using one of four categories: BACS, Direct Debit, Standing Order and Debit Card. In addition, officers have retrospectively added the payment type to all transactions for the 2024/25 financial year. This extra field allows easy identification and reporting of transactions by each of the four different payment methods.

Suggested Way Forward

After extensive consultation with Edge Support, officers are minded to propose the following to help clarify and simplify future Approval/Payment Lists.

Officers will provide councillors with two Approval/Payment Lists:

- one detailing forthcoming BACS payments for pre-authorisation
- one detailing Debit Card transactions seeking retrospective authorisation.

This split into two Approval/Payment Lists should result in timesaving, reduced risk of duplicate payments and reduced potential for confusion. After Council/Committee authorisation, officers will be able to work directly from the same BACS Approval/Payment List – without the need to remove all D/D, D/C and S/O payments – before seeking signatory approval for Edge and Lloyds payment.

Officers are not proposing to remove Direct debit and Standing Order payments from council oversight. In addition to providing the two new Approval/Payment Lists to Full Council and Business Committee, officers will produce two further reports showing all Direct Debit and Standing Order payments. Officers will not be seeking

retrospective approval for these payments but will produce the necessary reports to update Council/Committee on payments made to date.

Conclusion

The current methodology used by officers to seek Council approval requires a level of detail that is unnecessary and takes considerable time to train newcomers to the organisation to master.

With the recommended changes including necessary amendments to the Council's Financial Regulations, the process will be much simplified for users, signatories and report readers.

Recommendations

Subject to agreed changes to the Council's Financial Regulations, the following is recommended:

- Officers to produce two Approval/Payment Lists for FTC/BC approval: a BACS list for pre-authorisation and a Debit Card list for retrospective authorisation.
- In addition, officers will provide two new reports for Council/Committee oversight detailing Standing Order and Direct Debit payments made.

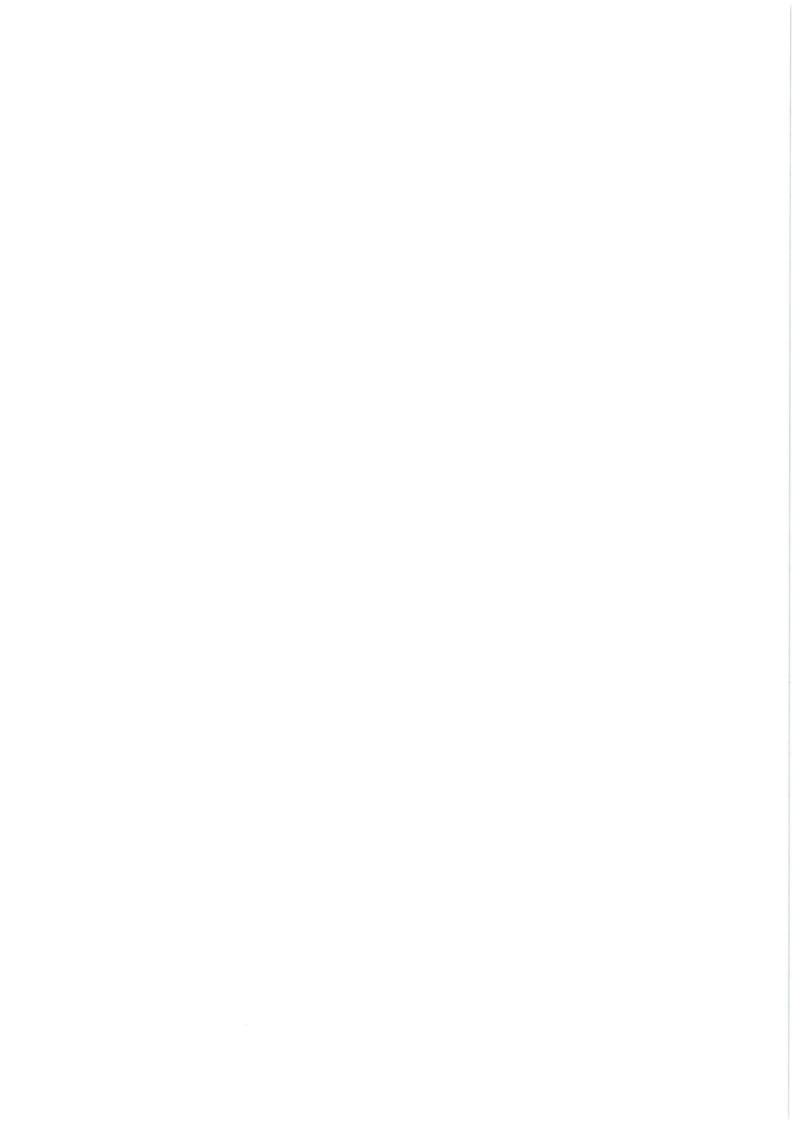

Pavilion Electricity Account Number - 2000103904

Up until November 2023, YU Energy were issuing invoices and taking monthly Direct Debit payment for the Pavilion's electricity bill.

Our understanding is that on 7th December 2023, YU Energy installed a smart meter in the Pavilion. From that date STC stopped receiving invoices and the Pavilion account disappeared from the STC YU Energy Online Account page. YU Energy also stopped taking payment by D/D after 8th December.

Officers chased YU Energy repeatedly from December 2023, explaining that we weren't receiving or paying any bills for the Pavilion, but, despite these repeated warnings from STC, YU Energy took no action.

On 8th August 2024, YU Energy demanded an immediate payment of £1481.79 as part payment on the Pavilion account. They threatened financial penalties if this wasn't done. STC paid the amount as requested. On the same day we realised that the missing invoices from December onwards and the account itself was now visible on the STC YU Energy Online Account.

On 19th August, an operative from YU Energy arrived at the Town Hall to demand immediate payment for the Pavilion account's outstanding amount of £4448.90. Failure to make payment would result in a penalty of at least £1000.

Councillors approved payment of the outstanding amount; the YU Energy operative insisted on a screenshot of our Lloyds account as proof.

Officers called Yu Energy to ask why payments hadn't been taken by Direct Debit - despite the invoices saying that they would be. Officers were told that the D/D for the Pavilion had been cancelled. (By whom is unknown.) We asked that it be re-instated and will check in September whether payment has been taken. Despite what we believed, YU Energy confirmed that the Pavilion does not have a smart meter.

 - (a) on the first payment date, a proportionate sum from that date to the next monthly payment date
 - (b) on each monthly payment date, one-twelfth of the annual rent
- 1.2 a fair proportion (decided by a surveyor whom the Landlord nominates) of the cost of repairing, maintaining and cleaning: party walls, party structures, yards, gardens, roads, paths, gutters, drains, sewers, pipes, conduits, wires, cables and things used or shared with other property
- 1.3 the cost (including professional fees) of any works to the property which the Landlord does after the Tenant defaults
- 1.4 the costs and expenses (including professional fees) which the Landlord incurs in:
 - (a) dealing with any application by the Tenant for consent or approval, whether it is given or not
 - (b) preparing and serving a notice of a breach of the Tenant's obligations, under section 146 of the Law of Property Act 1925, even if forfeiture of this lease is avoided without a court order
 - (e) preparing and serving schedules of dilapidations either during the lease term or recording failure to give up the property in the appropriate state of repair when this lease ends
 - (d) insuring the property under this lease
- 1.5 interest at the Law Society's interest rate on any of the above payments when more than fourteen days overdue, to be calculated from its due date
- 1.6 in making payments under this clause
 - (a) nothing is to be deducted or set off
 - (b) any value added tax payable is to be added
- The Tenant is also to make the following payments, with value added tax where payable:
- 2.1 all periodic rates, taxes and outgoings relating to the property, including any imposed after the date of this lease (even if of a novel nature), to be paid on the due date to the appropriate authorities

- 5.1 to maintain the state and condition of the property, but the Tenant need not alter or improve it except as required in clause 5.7
- 5.2 to decorate the inside and outside of the property:
 - (a) in every fifth year of the lease term
 - (b) in the last three months of the lease term (however it ends) except to the extent that it has been decorated in the previous year

- 5.3 not to make any structural alterations, external alterations or additions to the property
- 5.4 not to make any other alterations affecting services or systems in the property unless the Landlord gives written consent in advance (and the Landlord is not entitled to withhold that consent unreasonably)
- 5.5 to notify the Landlord of all alterations or additions to the property not covered by clauses 5.3 or 5.4
- 5.6 to keep any plate glass in the property insured for its full replacement cost with reputable insurers, to give the Landlord details of that insurance on request, and to replace any plate glass which becomes damaged
- 5.7 to do any work to the property required under a statute even if it alters or improves the property. The work is to be done on the following conditions
 - (a) before doing it, the Tenant is to obtain the Landlord's written consent (and the Landlord is not entitled to withhold that consent unreasonably)
 - (b) the Landlord is to contribute a fair proportion of the cost, taking into account any value of the work to the Landlord and any dispute is to be decided by arbitration under clause 14.3
- 5.8 if the Tenant fails to do any work which this lease requires and the Landlord gives the Tenant written notice to do it, to do that work. In such a case, the Tenant is to start the work within two months, or immediately in case of emergency, and proceed diligently with it. In default, the Tenant is to permit the Landlord to do the work
- 5,9 However, this clause
 - (a) does not require the Tenant-to-make good-damage by a risk-not required to be insured under clause 11.1 unless resulting from the act-or-default of the Tenant

6 TRANSFER ETC.

- 6 The Tenant is to comply with the following:

- (a) if the financial standing of the proposed transferce, and any guarantor, is lower than that of the current Tenant, or the proposed transferce is resident or registered overseas and
- (b) the Landlord reasonably requires
- a Tenant who transfers the whole of the property is to give the Landlord a written guarantee, in the terms set out in the Guarantee Box, that the transferee will perform the Tenant's obligations

7 OTHER MATTERS

- 7. The Tenant:
- 7.1 is to give the Landlord a copy of any notice concerning the property or any neighbouring property as soon as it is received
- 7.2 is to allow the Landlord, during the last six months of the lease term, to fix a notice in a reasonable position on the outside of the property announcing that it is for sale or to let

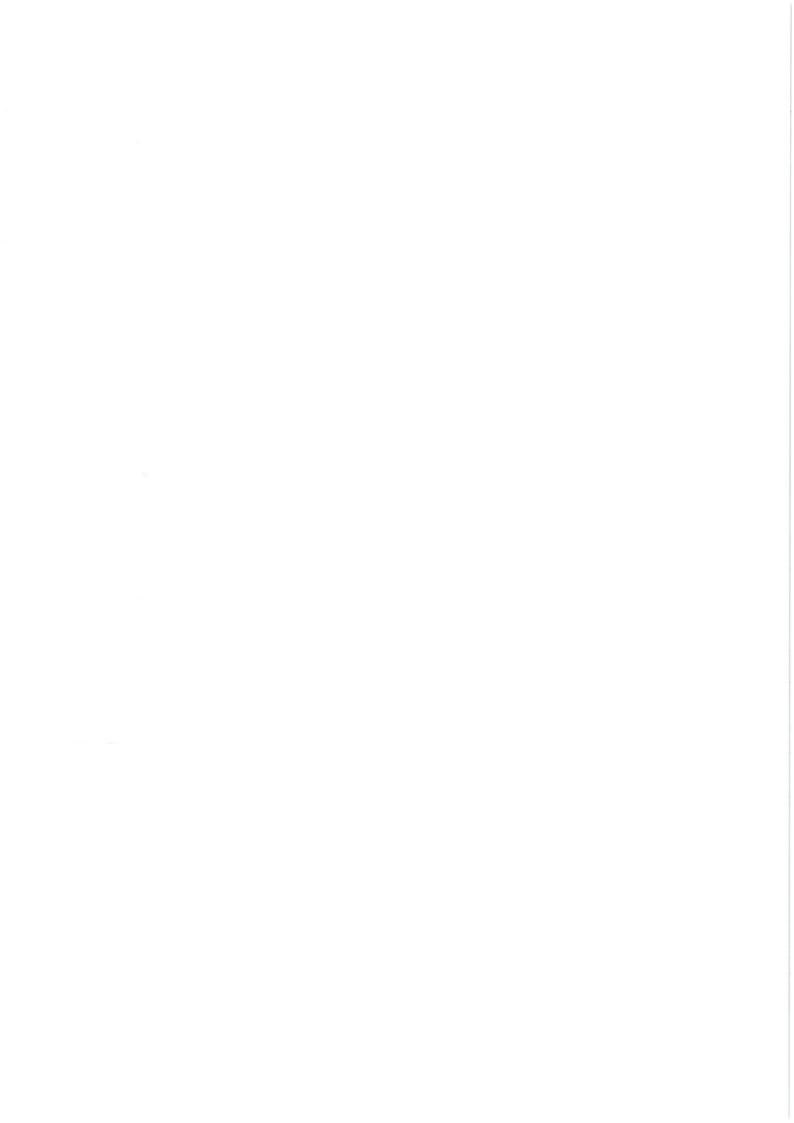
- 7.3 is not to apply for planning permission relating to the use of property or any addition or alteration unless the Landlord gives written consent in advance (and the Landlord is not entitled to withhold that consent unreasonably where the use or addition or alteration is permitted by this lease or has the Landlord's written consent)
- 7.4 in occupying, using and doing work on the property, is to comply with all statutory requirements

8 RENT REVIEW - MARKET RENT

- 8.1 On each rent review date, the rent is to increase to the market rent if that is higher than the rent applying before that date
- 8.2 The market rent is the rent which a willing tenant would pay for the property on the open market, if let on the rent review date by a willing landlord on a lease on the same terms as this lease without any premium and for a term equal to the remainder of the lease term, assuming that at the date:
 - (a) no account is taken of any goodwill belonging to anyone who has occupied the property
 - (b) the property is vacant and has not been occupied by the Tenant or any sub-tenant
 - (c) the property can immediately be used
 - (d) the property is in the condition required by this lease and any damage caused by any of the risks to be insured under clause 11 has been made good
 - (e) no tenant or sub-tenant has previously during the lease tenor done anything to the property to increase or decrease its rental value. In this paragraph "anything" includes work done by the Tenant to comply with clause 5.7, but nothing else which the Tenant was obliged to do under this lease
- 8.3 If the Landlord and the Tenant agree the amount of the new rent, a statement of that new rent, signed by them, is to be attached to this lease
- 8.4 If the Landlord and the Tenant have not agreed the amount of the new rent two months before the rent review date, either of them may require the new rent to be decided by arbitration under clause 14.3
- 8.5 (a) The Tenant is to pay rent at the rate applying before the rent review date until the next rent payment date after the new rent is agreed or decided
 - (b) Starting on that rent payment date, the Tenant is to pay the new rent

9 DAMAGE

- 9.4 If the insurers refuse to pay all or part of the insurance money because of the Tenant's act or default:
 - (a) to the extent of that refusal, the Tenant cannot claim the benefit of clause 9.1
 - (b) the Tenant cannot serve notice under clause 9.2
- 9.5 If the property is damaged (but not as a result of the act or default of the Tenant) by a risk not required to be insured under clause 11.1 and as a result of that damage the property, or any part of it, cannot be used for the use allowed:
 - (a) the rent or a fair proportion of it is to be suspended for three years or, if earlier, until the whole property can again be used for the use allowed
- 9.6 Any dispute under any part of this clause is to be decided by arbitration under clause 14.3



LANDLORD'S OBLIGATIONS AND FORFEITURE RIGHTS

10 QUIET ENJOYMENT

10. The Landlord is to allow the Tenant to possess and use the property without lawful interference from the Landlord, anyone who derives title from the Landlord or any trustee for the Landlord

11 INSURANCE

11. The Tenant is to:

- 11.1 keep the property insured on reasonable terms with reputable insurers to cover:
 - (a) full rebuilding, site clearance, professional fees, value added tax and loss of income
 - (b) against fire, lightning, explosion, carthquake, landslip, subsidence, heave, riot, civil commotion, aircraft, aerial devices, storm, flood, water, theft, impact by vehicles, damage by malicious persons and vandals and third party liability and other risks reasonably required by the Landlord

so far as cover is available at normal insurance rates for the locality and subject to reasonable excesses and exclusions

- 11.2 take all necessary steps to make good as soon as possible all damage to the property by insured risks except to the extent that the insurance money is not paid because of the act or default of the Tenant
- 11.3 give the Landlord on request once a year:
 - (a) particulars of the policy and evidence from the insurer that it is in force
 - (b) details of any commission received by the Tenant for that insurance

12 FORFEITURE

- 12. This lease comes to an end if the Landlord forfeits it by entering any part of the property, which the Landlord is entitled to do whenever:
 - (a) payment of any rent is fourteen days overdue, even if it was not formally demanded
 - (b) the Tenant has not complied with any of the terms of this lease
 - (c) the Tenant if an individual (and if more than one, any of them) is adjudicated bankrupt or an interim receiver of the Tenant's property is appointed

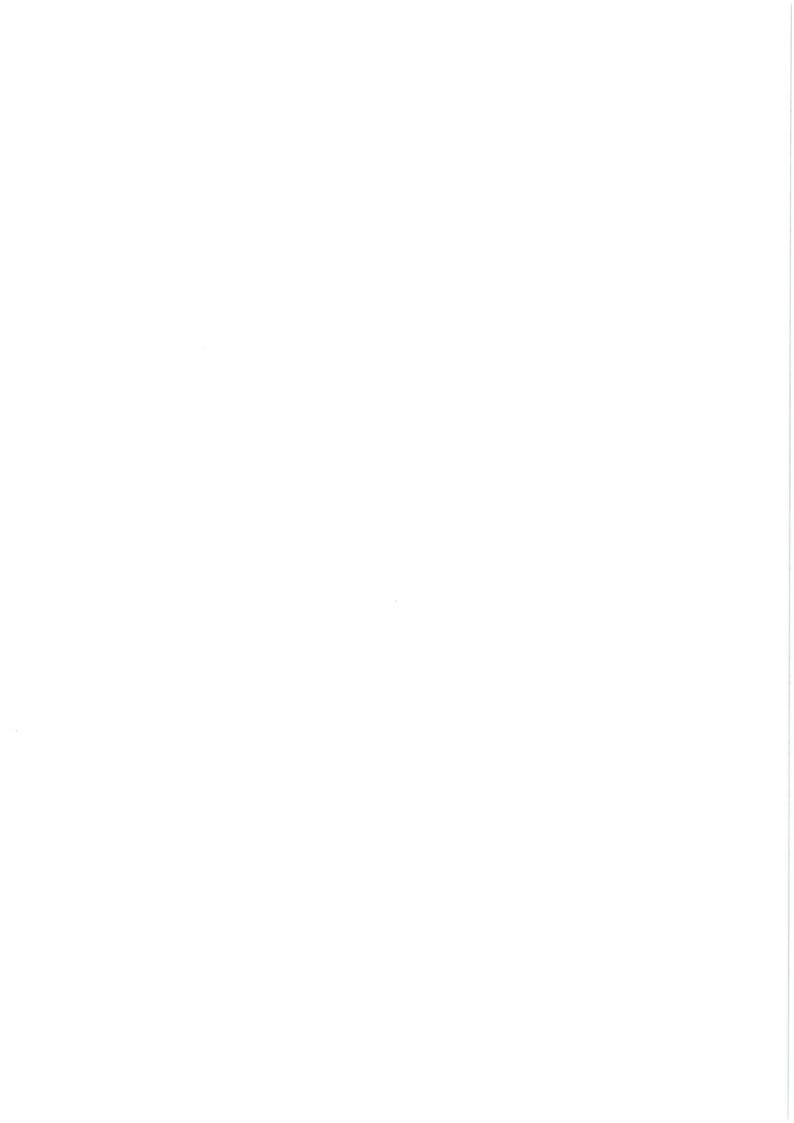

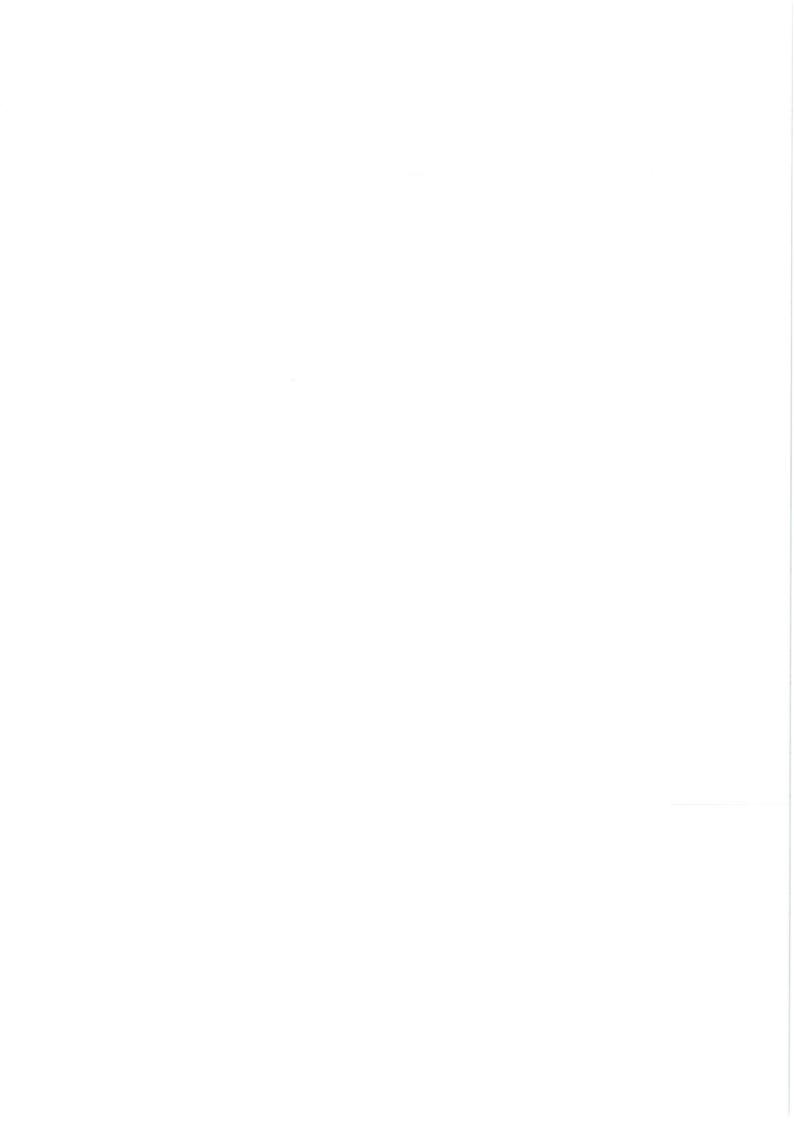

As requested, please find below a refreshed summary of our proposal for the town council's consideration towards extending 'The Nest' at Stonehouse Town Football Club.

STFC 'The Nest' Extension - Revised August 2024:

Stonehouse Town Football Club are seeking permission from Stonehouse Town Council to extend 'The Nest' at The Ben's Takeaway Stadium on Oldends Lane, Stonehouse, GL10 2DG.

Following a meeting on 18th May 2024 with representatives from Oldends Lane Working Group and Stonehouse Town Football Club, amendments and further information were requested and provided in time for STFC's proposal to be discussed at the Town Business Committee on 3rd June 2024. It was noted that; 'council agreed with the potential extension of the football club's new welfare facility but stated that nothing would be agreed until the new lease was agreed'.

It is understood that with thanks to the Town Clerk, STFC have (subject to fencing adjustments being completed) addressed concerns regarding the new lease document, therefore are requesting the following to be proposed for approval at the Town Business Committee on Monday 9th September 2024.

Proposal:

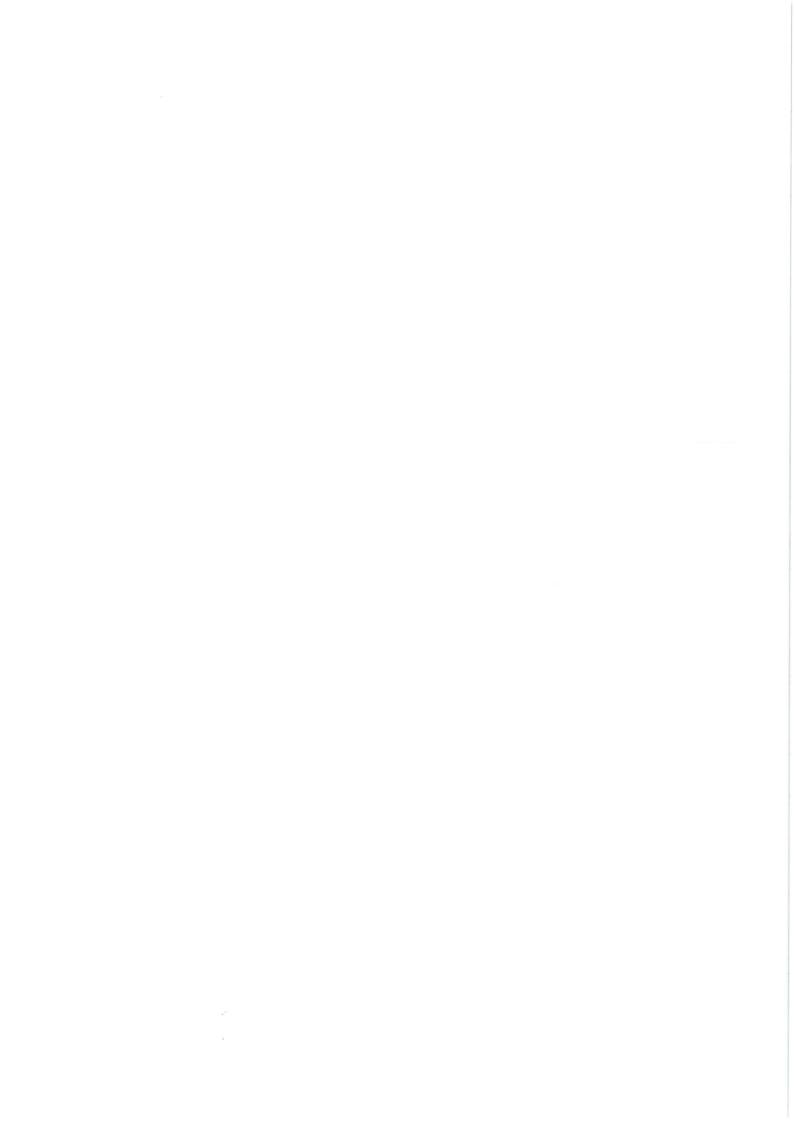
Following the creation of our new 13m x 6m community building, now called 'The Nest', we have received an overwhelmingly positive response from the local community towards our new facility. In fact, our tenants, Stonehouse Town Council, recognised STFC as their Community Group of the Year for both 2023 and 2024!

We are however, now very much victims of our own success, with our very modest building now not big enough to host all of the players / supporters / organisations that wish to use the facility. Therefore, in order to cater for everyone who wishes to use the facility, we are proposing to install one additional module $(13m \times 3m)$, in the middle of the existing building, which will increase the usable floor space by >58%.

STFC have instructed Thomas Dean Architects to complete detailed drawings for our proposal and are pleased to attach the following documents for your consideration:

SERVICE LEVEL AGREEMENT

The following constitutes a service level agreement dated 21 April 2021 between

The Door Youth Project ('The Door') of 44-45 High Street, Stroud, GL5 1AN, and

Stonehouse Town Council ('STC') of Town Hall, High Street, Stonehouse, GL10 2NG

for the provision of youthwork services in Stonehouse from 1 April 2021 to 31 March 2022.

1. GENERAL TERMS AND CONDITIONS

- 1.1. The Door and STC recognize the value in working in partnership to meet the needs of young people in Stonehouse.
- 1.2. From 1 April 2021, The Door will provide **3 x 2 hour sessions** of 'open access' youthwork per week at The Pod Youth Centre, Oldends Lane, Stonehouse, GL10 2DG ('the centre') for 50 weeks each year a total of 150 sessions per year.
- 1.3. Sessions will be open to all young people of appropriate age for the session.
- 1.4. Session days and times will be mutually agreed between both parties, taking into account feedback from young people resident in the town. Sessions may also be altered to become detached street work by mutual agreement.
- 1.5. All sessions will be run by a minimum of two youthworkers. The Door will seek to recruit locally as far as possible, and will provide opportunities for local people to volunteer during sessions.
- 1.6. The Door will provide a named Community Youthwork Coordinator to manage the provision and be the main point of day-to-day contact for STC.
- 1.7. Alongside the structured sessions, additional time will be allocated for the Community Youthwork Coordinator to engage with the local community, council and other stakeholders.
- 1.8. The officers responsible for this agreement will be the Chief Executive Officer for The Door, and the Town Clerk for STC.
- 1.9. Changes to the agreement may also be made at other times by mutual consent between the parties. Suggested changes should be notified in writing to the other party, and an adhoc review meeting scheduled to reach a mutual agreement.
- 1.10. Neither The Door nor STC shall be liable to the other for any failure to fulfil its obligations under this agreement caused by circumstances beyond its reasonable control, such as adverse weather conditions, natural disasters or civil disturbances.
- 1.11. This agreement can be terminated by either party giving 6 months' notice in writing.
- 1.12. If either party considers the other to be in breach of their duties under this agreement or has a grievance about some aspect of the agreement's operation, the responsible officers shall make every effort to resolve the issue through joint discussions. Where this fails, the party wishing to make the complaint should provide the other with written details, including proposals for resolving it, and a written response should be sent within 14 days. If the response does not provide a satisfactory resolution, on written request the issue should



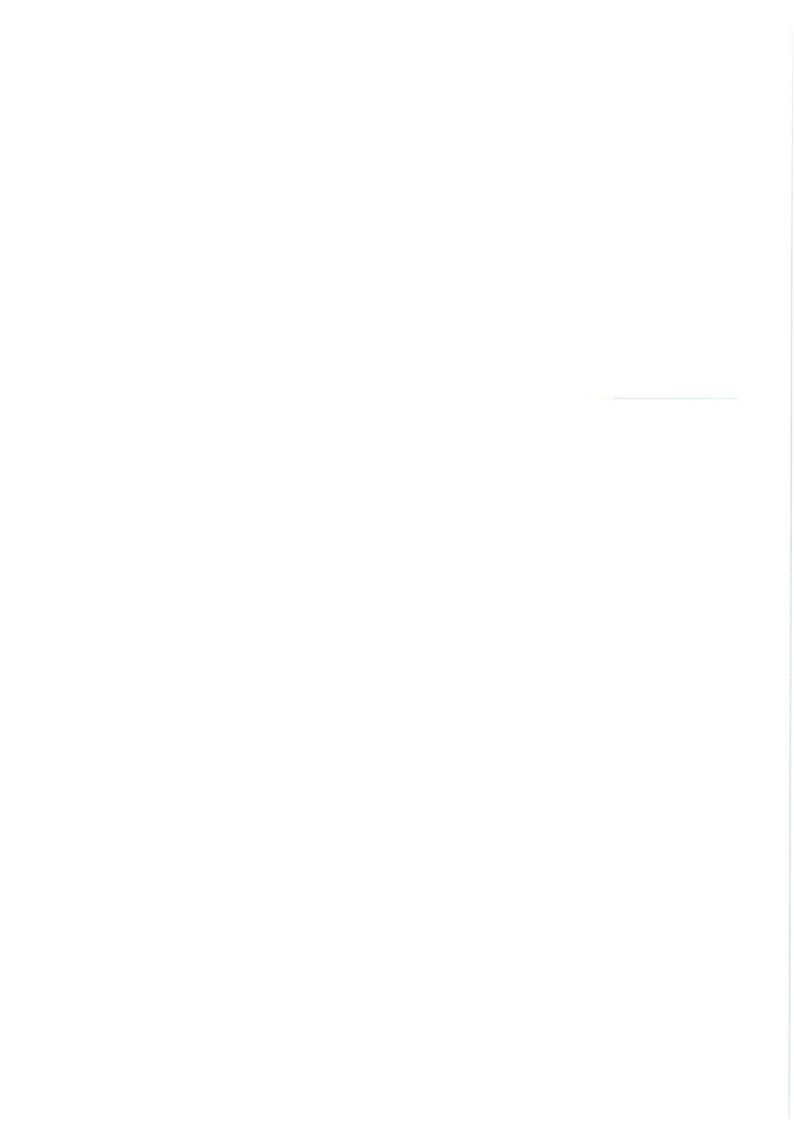
be considered by the Board of Trustees in the case of The Door, or the relevant committee in the case of STC, as a confidential item. Any submissions should be sent in advance to the other party, and representation is permitted at the relevant meeting. If the breach still cannot be rectified, this agreement may be terminated by either party by giving 3 months' notice in writing.

2. THE DOOR:

- 2.1. Will ensure that the Community Youthwork Coordinator or a Community Youthworker is present at all sessions.
- 2.2. Will provide additional Sessional Youthworkers to staff each session. There will at least one Sessional Youthworker in every session, and over the year there will be an average of two.
- 2.3. Will be responsible for the spiritual and professional development of delivery staff throughout the contract.
- 2.4. Will ensure that all sessions are run in accordance with The Door's Health and Safety and Safeguarding policies and procedures.
- 2.5. Will maintain employer's liability insurance cover of £10,000,000 and public liability cover of £5,000,000 for its activities.
- 2.6. Will seek to take an active involvement in the life of the community as a whole.
- 2.7. Will engage volunteers in training and development opportunities as a part of the wider youthwork team at The Door.
- 2.8. Will notify STC as soon as possible of any health and safety issues pertaining to the centre, and of any safeguarding incidents.
- 2.9. Will notify STC on the next working day of any damage to or around the centre sustained during a youthwork session, and will liaise with STC regarding the process for rectification of the damage.
- 2.10. Will provide a quarterly report to STC of the outcomes of the provision.
- 2.11. Will, if it proves necessary to cancel a session, provide a substitute session at a time to be agreed between The Door and STC.
- 2.12. Will work collaboratively with STC to seek and procure additional sources of funding for additional community youthwork activity in the town based on the needs of the local young people and the wider community, including delivering targeted services for specific needs.
- 2.13. Will work within the General Data Protection Regulation and Data Protection Act 2018 and adhere to STC's policy regarding the use of CCTV equipment at the centre.

3. STONEHOUSE TOWN COUNCIL:

- 3.1. Will retain responsibility for all aspects of the centre, including waste management and the rectification of any damage.
- 3.2. Will respect the confidentiality of youthwork being carried out by The Door.
- 3.3. Will ensure that all equipment in the centre is in full working order, and that all on-site safety equipment, including fire equipment and first aid kits, is regularly checked and certified, with all consumable supplies in date.
- 3.4. Will provide The Door with 3 sets of keys to access the centre, and with secure storage facilities for The Door's property at the centre.



- 3.5. Will provide The Door with the use of office facilities at the centre comprising a desk, chair, lockable cupboard and wifi.
- 3.6. Will make reasonable additional provision for youthwork resources at the centre requested by the Community Youthwork Coordinator throughout the period of this agreement. These resources will remain the property of STC.
- 3.7. Will seek to involve The Door in community activities in the town where appropriate.
- 3.8. Will promote The Door and all of its services.

4. PAYMENTS

- 4.1. In consideration of the service provision detailed above, STC will pay The Door the sum of £37,360, invoiced quarterly in advance at the rate of £9,340 per quarter, with payment due by return on receipt of invoice.
 - Note: This price is exclusive of VAT. It may become necessary for The Door to register for VAT during the course of this agreement.
- 4.2. In the event of notice being given for the cancellation of this agreement, the final quarter's invoice will be adjusted proportionally for the length of the period remaining until the effective date of cancellation.
- 4.3. These amounts would only be adjusted as a result of an agreement between The Door and STC to amend the level of service provision.
- 4.4. The Door reserves the right to charge interest on balances still unpaid after 30 days.
- 4.5. If The Door should cease to operate or go into receivership or administration, then subject to Charities and Insolvency Law and when other liabilities have been met, any outstanding balances will be repaid to STC.

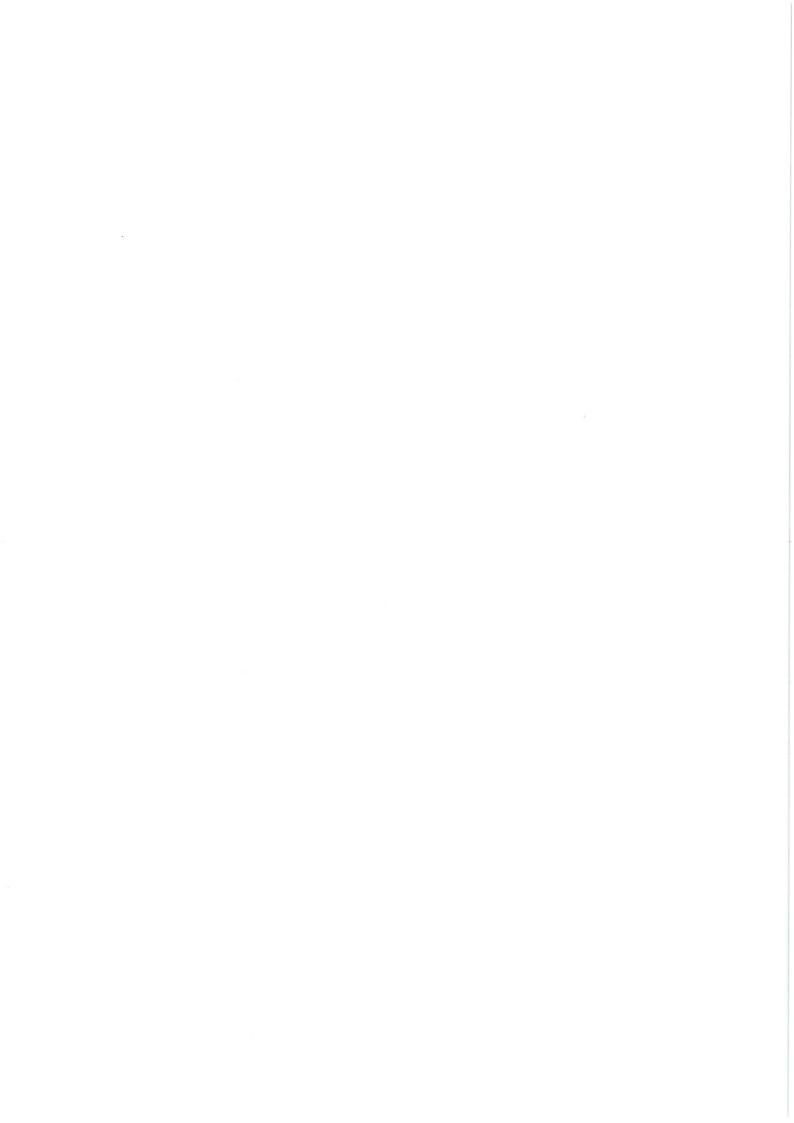

- Develop, manage and deliver demand-led, free-access youth provision in Stonehouse.
- Facilitate and develop youth participation and representation in Stonehouse.

2. Source of financing

Stonehouse Town Council (STC) have allocated funding for the provision of youth work for the period 2022 - 2025, which may be supplemented by further grant or project funding over the course of the SLA.

3. Tender allocation

An annual sum in the region of £40,000 is available for the provision of the core??? work outlined in this document. This is to include staffing, volunteer costs and related insurance, travel, preparation time and marketing. The commissioned organisation will also provide its own transportation, Information Communication Technology (ICT) and other equipment (including equipment needed for activities, if not already in place within the community) and all consumable materials required to meet the objectives and provide activities and services for young people detailed above????.

4. Method of payment

Payment will be made quarterly in advance and within 30 calendar days of receipt of an agreed invoice.

5. Eligibility

Stonehouse Town Council will welcome applications from organisations with:

- Relevant and demonstrable experience in working with young people aged 11 19
- Ability to provide appropriate youth and community work programmes which are positive and progressive
- Ability to provide appropriately qualified personnel the minimum requirement include at least NVQ Level 3 in 'Youth Work' for lead staff and NVQ Level 2 for junior staff.

Delivery period: The SLA period will be from 1st April 2022 – 31st March 2025,

7. The Commissioner of the Service

The commissioner of the Service Level Agreement is Stonehouse Town Council.

The SLA will be monitored by the Stonehouse Youth Working Group who will be reporting regularly to Stonehouse Town Council. . A quarterly review meeting will be held to monitor progress and reports will also be supplied to the council. Stonehouse Town Council works with a range of organisations and youth groups to develop and complement current provision and identify future needs.

The operating office for the Service Level Agreement is Stonehouse Town Council, Town Hall, Queens Road, Stonehouse, Gloucestershire GL10 2QA.

8. Objectives of the Service

- a) Undertake a core of high quality, direct youth service delivery to young people (11-19 years) in Stonehouse. This will be informed initially through the results of a consultation already carried out in the parish with young people and the wider community.
- b) Regularly review provision with young people, leading to ongoing development, through identifying ways to improve delivery.
- c) Create and maintain a voice for young people from Stonehouse, through the maintenance and strengthening of links with key stakeholders (such as Stroud District Youth Council and Youth Forum) and
- d) Develop citizenship through youth participation and involvement.



9. Outcomes of the service.

Project delivery outcomes will be developed between Stonehouse Town Council and the successful provider.

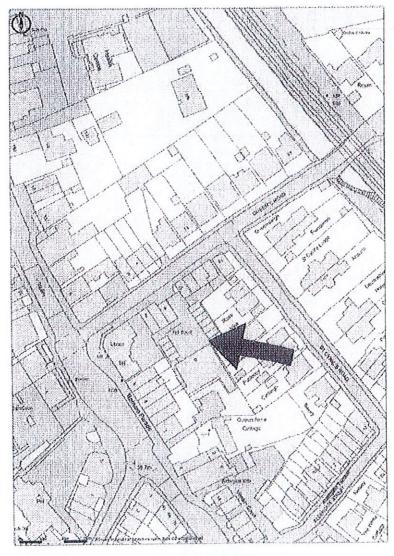

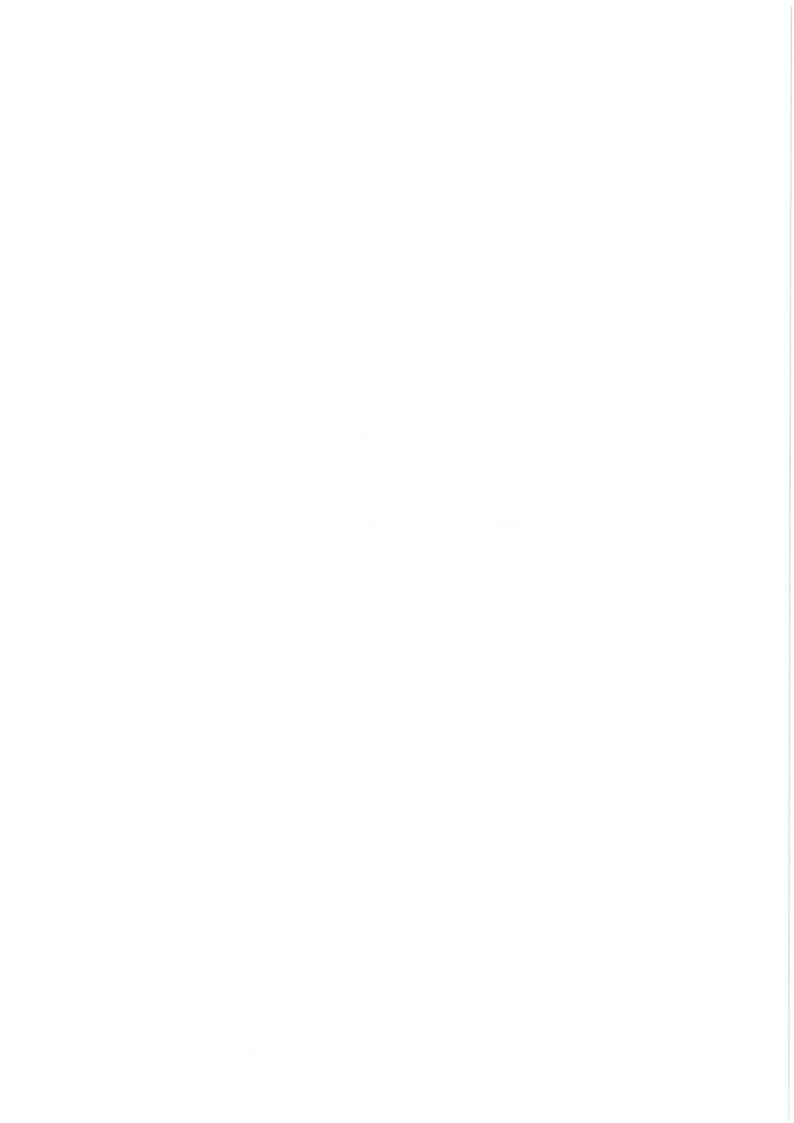
